** Example: By the end of spring quarter, Student A had completed 30 college level credits at Seattle Central. She then enrolled in 15 credits for summer quarter. During summer quarter, with 30 credits completed, Student A applied for the fall quarter Merit Scholarship by the July 15 deadline. She then completed her 15 summer quarter credits at the end of August. When fall quarter classes began, Student A had completed the minimum required amount of 45 credits, making her eligible to receive the scholarship.
